ROAD SAFETY

Council has heard concerns raised by residents, regarding certain areas of roadway within the Town, that are considered to pose risk to pedestrians and the motoring public. Please know, your concerns do not fall <mark>on deaf ears. The</mark> areas of road in question, fall under the iurisdiction of the Provincial Government Department of Transportation and Infrastructure. While driving in Eastport, it is everyone's responsibility, to adhere to the posted speed limit; this would ensure roads are safer for motorist and pedestrian's.

Flashing Amber Lights have been ordered and will be installed in the area of Lanes Road and Eastport **Beach intersection onto Beach** Road. It is our hope, that these lights will remind motorists to slow down!

You are reminded, the area of Church Street / Beach Road at the intersection of Bank Road, the speed limit is **30km/hr.** Another option for this area, could be a NO LEFT TURN - a possibility to explore with the Department.

Northside Road with its numerous turns and hills, driveways and entrance to Northside Beach is definitely an area to use extra caution as well.

Council News

Recreation: The rink is finally resurfaced! It has been lined for a Pickleball court and the nets are up. We will be adding lines for other sports soon. Council wishes to acknowledge a generous donation of \$500 for the Pickleball net and court paint.

Public Engagement: Coffee with Council was a tremendous success! A great afternoon of conversation on topics ranging from brush cutting, to taxes, to septic disposal, to emergency management and much more. One issue brought to our attention was lack of garbage cans and dog waste disposal receptacles - rest assured this is already in the works to help keep the Town clean and tidy! The next Coffee with Council is scheduled to take place on Thursday, August 29 from 2-4pm; we hope to see you there!

Finance & Administration: The committee is gearing up for budget 2025. Deputy Mayor Monica Bull has created a Budget Request template to help facilitate and streamline the process of preparing Budget 2025. The Town is still waiting to see if we will be a recipient of MCWP funding to begin the work on Church Street infrastructure, will continue to apply and carry forward the standard 10% representing the Municipal portion. During the July 14th, meeting a motion was made to include the purchase of a JCB Backhoe in the 2025 budget. The 2023 audit is expected to be completed in the coming weeks, and a motion was made to retain Jody Cooper as Auditor for 2024.

Public Works: Like many rural towns similar to Eastport, Public Works staff will have the capability to do snow clearing, water & sewer digs, ditching, general maintenance work, and much more with the purchase of equipment planned for 2025. After reviewing past years spending, it is noted that the Town pays on average almost \$70,000 annually, for services requiring equipment (not including grading). Owning this piece of equipment will increase the efficiency of our Public Works staff, provide some savings during the term of financing, and prove to be exceptionally cost effective afterward. Your Council is digging in to ensure your tax dollars go further!
