## 2024 in Periew

2024 has been a year marked by challenges and often chaotic times, yet meaningful progress has been achieved by Council in various service sectors, underscoring our resilience and adaptability.

Resolute in our pursuit of improved traffic safety at the intersection of Lanes Road and Beach Road; we persisted in efforts until a favorable outcome was realized. Council is ongoing in it's pursuit of additional solutions for other problematic areas.

Financial statements for all prior years are complete, and we are working closely with auditors to maintain compliance.

The water tower computer system suffered a catastrophic failure, causing the system to fail entirely and requiring a full replacement.

The public works maintenance truck requires replacing, a new truck should arrive before yearend, with the associated costs shared with Happy Adventure and Salvage.

Electricity has been made available for mobile vendors, at the recreation grounds and Eastport beach; this will enhance dining experience for both residents and visitors to the area. The rink resurfacing project has been completed, yielding a high-quality multi-court surface for gameplay.

The Town Plan review is now underway, the first public consultation has taken place, with more to come in 2025.

A balanced, achievable budget, aimed at improving services with minimal fee increases, has been adopted for the coming year.

Councilors are dedicated to implementing well-defined policies and standards for new councilors, in the fall election of 2025.



Student's in Ms. Randell's Kindergarten/Grade One class welcomed Mayor Powell (a.k.a Ms. Kim) to their classroom for a discussion on decision-making. Afterwards, they visited council chambers, where they learned about the decision-making process. A motion to eat snacks at council was defeated, with 2 votes in favor and 3 against. Students then headed

back to school, with their snacks for recess!
